Dear Friend,

From the very bottom of our hearts, thank you for standing alongside us in compassion and action. Because of your generous support, the past year has been one of meaningful transformation for so many in Greater Victoria. Whether through donations, volunteer time, advocacy, or sharing our story, you have made nourishment, dignity, and hope possible.

Over the past fiscal year, the demand for food assistance has soared. In March 2024 alone, Canadians made over 2 million visits to food banks, the highest number ever recorded — a 6% increase over 2023 and a staggering 90% increase since 2019. In British Columbia, visits rose by 81% in that period, as incomes fail to keep pace with inflation and housing costs.

Despite this sharp rise, your support helped us continue meeting the moment.

Thanks to you:

- Over 2.8 million pounds of food, hygiene, and essential items were distributed across communities in need.
- More than 65,000 people received monthly vital support—from fresh meals and hygiene kits to crafted hampers and hospitality services—That's more than 15% of the population of Greater Victoria.
- Over 25,500 volunteer hours brought warmth, respect, and care to every person we serve.

Your gift is more than just resources—it's a lifeline. It ensures that when someone walks into our

Market, they're met with choice. It gives the Hospitality program the fuel to serve hot meals, coffee, and conversations. And it powers unique partnerships—from Flourish! School Food Society to South Island Farm Hub, all working collaboratively in a shared space to strengthen our region's food ecosystem.

You've helped us respond to rising demand, support diverse dietary needs, and build relationships rooted in respect and compassion. We couldn't do this work without you.

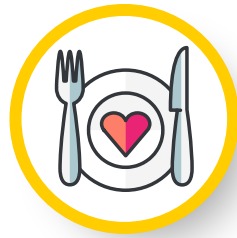

Our warehouse serves as the hub for inbound donations and outbound shipments, supplying both our internal Food Bank and more than 75 partner agencies through The Food Share Network. Each weekday, our fleet collects over 10,000 lbs of food from 32+ grocery and farm partners, which staff and volunteers sort and dispatch. We also lease storage space to mission-aligned nonprofits and social enterprises, creating opportunities for collaboration and innovation.

This work supports tens of thousands of individuals monthly, strengthens the regional food system, and promotes environmental sustainability by preventing waste. By hosting nonprofit tenants, we amplify impact across the food security ecosystem.

40,500+ lbs of unsaleable but usable food diverted to local small farms as livestock feed.

Food Rescue Program

Three trucks run weekday routes to more than 32 grocery and farm partners, with an added Saturday route launched in 2024. Donations are sorted in our warehouse by staff and volunteers. Items suitable for distribution are shared with our Food Bank and 62 partner agencies. Food not viable for redistribution is repurposed into hot meals served daily at Hospitality and Coffee Window programs.

The program reduces waste, prevents hunger, and strengthens community resilience. It turns potential waste into meals, creates equity across diverse communities, and supports environmental sustainability.

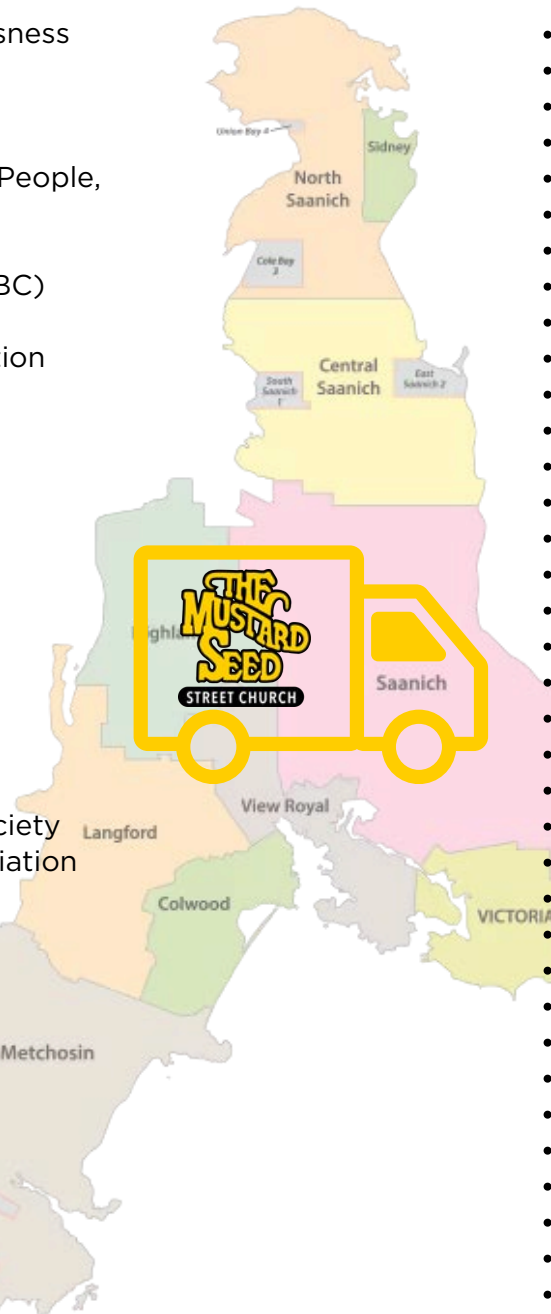

Special Hamper Program

Provide ready-to-distribute food hampers to agencies supporting low-income individuals, seniors, and day programs—ensuring consistent and reliable access to essentials.

Hampers are prepared in-house and delivered monthly to 13 partner agencies. Each includes pantry staples and dry goods, typically covering 2–3 meals.

The program increases access to consistent food support and allows agencies to enhance their own services with reliable, nutritious resources.

Community Meals Program

Transform rescued food into nourishing, home-cooked meals that provide nutrition, community, and dignity for those accessing our Food Bank and Hospitality services.

Operating Monday through Friday, our kitchen team prepares seven hot meals weekly plus a monthly weekend breakfast. Meals are created primarily from rescued food, maximizing nutrition while minimizing waste.

This program elevates rescued food into freshly prepared meals, enriching the social and emotional well-being of hundreds of guests each week while reducing waste and hunger.

Guest Services staff and volunteers meet with community members, helping them navigate housing, healthcare, and government support services. Partnerships bring additional resources on-site, including weekly visits from the MediVan for nurses and wound care, Ministry of Social Development for income assistance orientation, Soap for Hope that offers hygiene products, BC Hydro with information on how to access energy-saving kits, and Inlet Hearing that provides hearing aids.

Guest Services addresses root needs beyond food, supporting dignity, education, health, and stability. By forming strategic partnerships, we amplify our impact and minimize the duplication of services.

Hospitality Program

At Hospitality, each day begins with coffee, tea, hot chocolate, soup, sandwiches, and baked goods, with cold drinks in summer. At lunch, a hot meal is served. Clothing is distributed daily, with extra support during cold or wet weather. Hospitality also offers creative and social programming, including art club, board games, movie nights, bingo, and live music dinners.

Hospitality provides far more than food—it is a stable, safe space for community members to rest, connect, and be supported, addressing both immediate needs and social wellbeing.

Hope Farm

Hope Farm grows organic produce and cares for 399 pasture-run hens, with food distributed both through sales and donations to food banks in Cowichan Valley and Victoria.

Hundreds of dozens of eggs and fresh produce provided locally.

Ongoing donations supported individuals and families experiencing food insecurity.



Our Pastoral Team provides both structured gatherings and personal care. Programming includes Sunday worship, weekday devotions, Bible study and discipleship groups, outdoor hikes, camps, memorials, and hospital visits. Pastors also provide daily presence across all ministries.

Spiritual Care creates opportunities for worship and community, while also offering comfort during illness, grief, and daily challenges. It grounds our ministry in faith, love, and service.

Each December, more than 1,800 people receive hampers including fresh produce, dairy, non-perishable food, and all the fixings for a holiday meal. Grocery store gift cards offer choice, while gifts for children and adults ensure everyone is remembered.

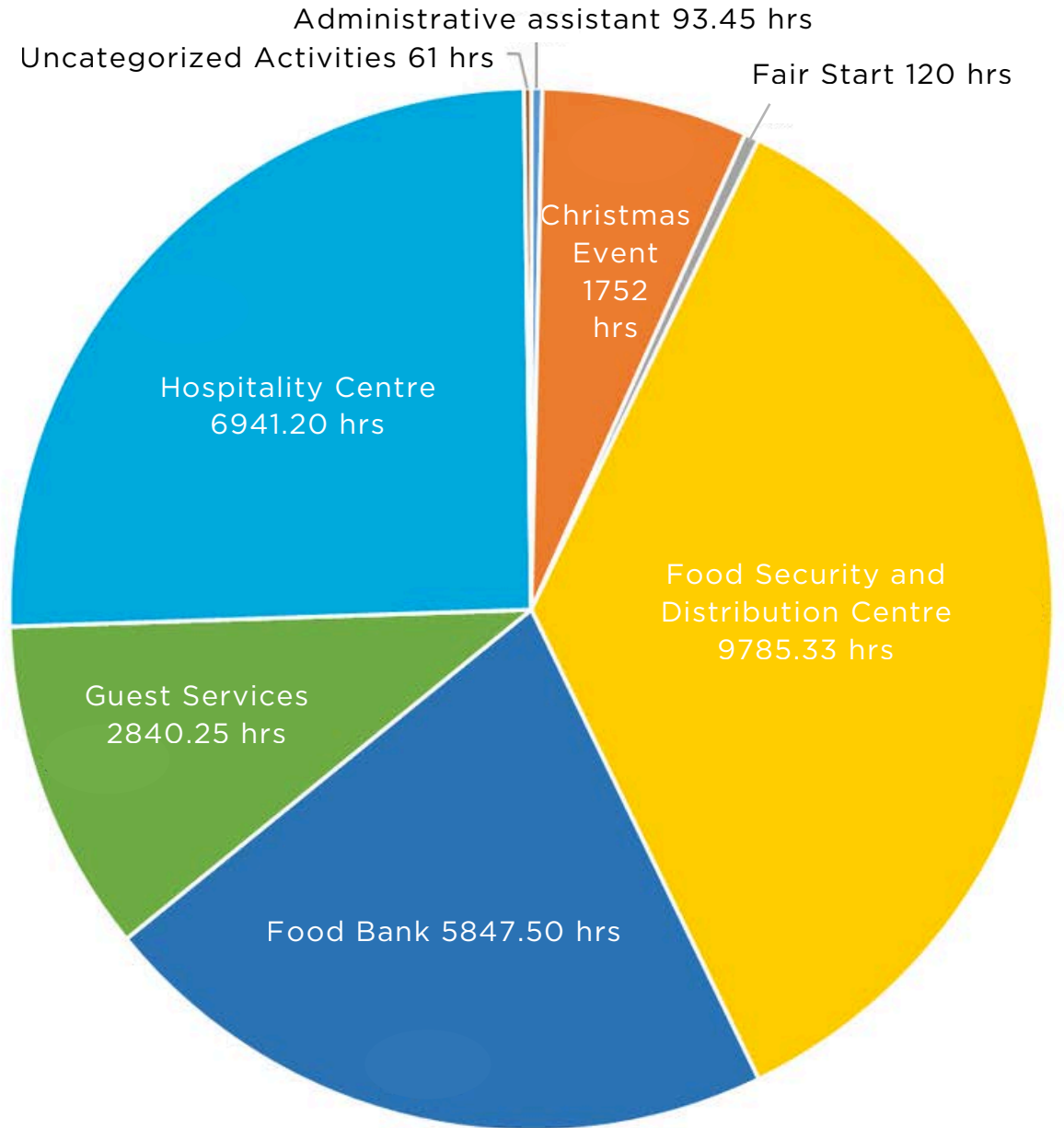

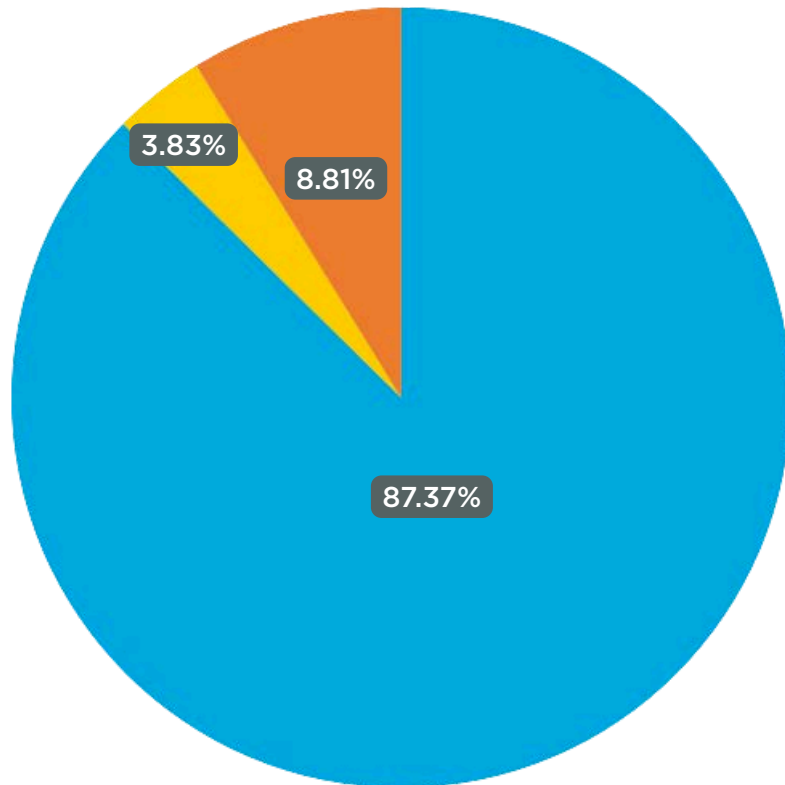

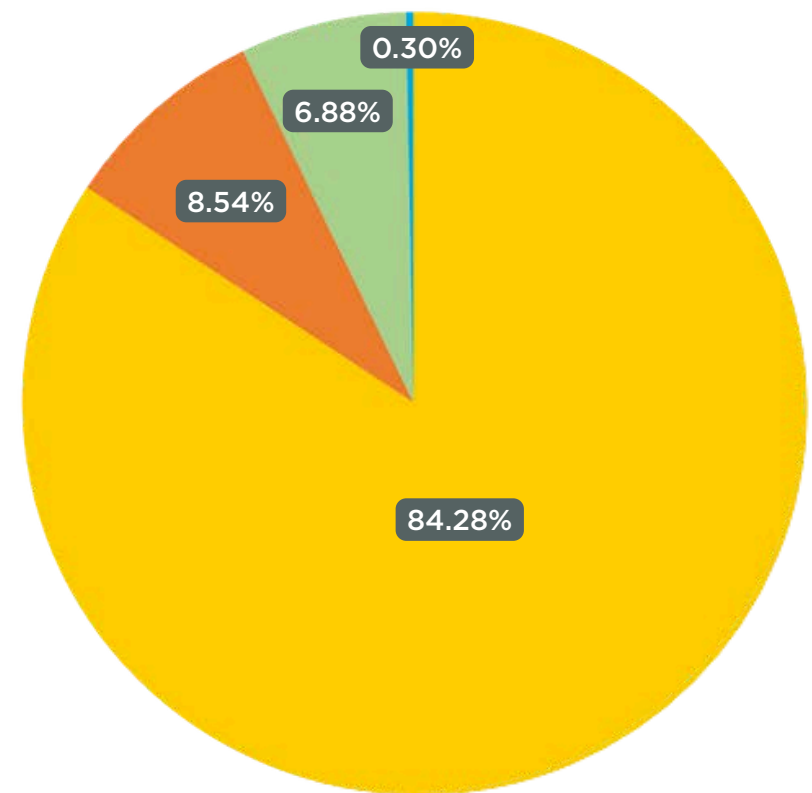
